

TrueCouponing.com Coupon Lingo

\$1/3 - A coupon value; Means \$1 off (3) items, you need to buy all (3) items to receive the \$1 off

3/\$5 - A sale price; Means (3) items for \$5; doesn't necessarily mean that you MUST buy (3) items to receive the discounted sale price

Blinkie - In store coupon machine usually with a blinking red light that dispenses coupons

BOGO/B1G1 - Buy One Get One Free

BR - Balance Reward (reward system at Walgreens)

CAT or Catalina - Coupon dispensed at register after purchase

CRT - Cash Register Tape

DND5 or DND9 - "Do Not Double" (barcode starts with a 5 or 9) the manufacture will not pay double to the store when reimbursing the coupon

ECB - Extra Care Buck (reward system at CVS)

FF - Mozilla Firefox Web Browser

FREE-FREE - BOGO Sale paired with a BOGO Q; Makes both items FREE

GM - General Mills coupon insert found in the Sunday newspaper

IE - Internet Explorer Web Browser

IP - Internet Printable coupon

Mfg or Mfr - Manufacturer Coupon

MIR - Mail In Rebate

MM - Money Maker (Value of the coupon exceeds the price paid for an item)

MQ - Manufacturer Coupon (color coded RED on store lists)

NED - No Expiration Date

OOP - Out of pocket

Overage - Another name for "Money Maker" (Value of the coupon exceeds the price paid for an item)

OYNO - On Your Next Order

Peelie - Peel off coupon (like a sticker) found on an item

PG or P&G - Procter & Gamble coupon insert in Sunday paper

PSA - Prices Starting At

Q - Coupon

RP - Red Plum coupon insert in the Sunday newspaper

RR - Register Rewards (reward system at Walgreens)

SQ - Store Coupon (color coded GREEN on store lists)

SS - SmartSource coupon insert in the Sunday newspaper

Stacking - Using one SQ and one MQ on an item

Tearpad - Coupons found on a "pad" of paper in the store, usually hanging on a shelf

UPC - Universal Product Code (barcode)

Wags - Walgreens

WSL - While Supplies Last

WYB - When You Buy

YMMV - Your Mileage May Vary/Your Manager May Vary
